Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

At St. Margaret of Scotland students are expected to be:

- A discerning believer formed in the Catholic Faith community who celebrates the signs and sacred mystery of God's presence through word, sacrament, prayer, forgiveness, reflection, and moral living.
- An effective communicator who speaks, writes, and listens honestly and sensitively, responding critically in light of gospel values.
- A reflective, creative, and holistic thinker who solves problems and makes responsible decisions with an informed moral conscience for the common good.
- A self-directed, responsible, lifelong learner who develops and demonstrates their God-given potential.
- A collaborative contributor who finds meaning, dignity and vocation in work which respects the rights of all and contributes to the common good.
- A caring family member who attends to family, school, parish, and the wider community.
- A responsible citizen who gives witness to Catholic social teaching by promoting peace, justice, and the sacredness of human life.

At St. Margaret of Scotland, we conduct OCGSE and Virtue assemblies that recognize those students who model and strive to emulate the virtues and the OCSGEs.

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

The Virtues program is an integral component of our Catholic school. Classroom teachers regularly implement the program through integration with daily curriculum and learning opportunities. School staff infuse the virtues when assisting students to problem-solve and learn how to better foster relationships with peers. Classes prepare monthly liturgies/presentations on the Virtue of the Month. Parents/Guardians and family members are invited to celebrate the Virtue of the month as recipients from each class receive recognition for demonstrating the Virtue of the month.

September – Faith October – Empathy November – Conscience December - Hope March - Kindness **April - Love** January – Self Control February – Respect

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

Symbols of our faith are visible in each classroom and throughout the school. Liturgical cloths, Crosses and bibles in front hall, sacred spaces in each classroom, Advent wreaths, candles and books that speak to our Catholic faith are evident, especially during our masses, liturgies, and celebrations.

The display case and entrance to the school welcomes all who enter through our doors and gives a strong message to our visitors that St. Margaret of Scotland School is a Catholic School in word, deed, and action. Staff and students are committed to Catholic Education and living out our Faith daily through prayer, reflections, and good acts of charity.

Each class is involved in daily prayers over the public address system. Readings are taken from a variety of sources: Children's Daily Prayer, and resources from Lenten and Advent Handbooks. Children also create their own prayers and thoughts for the day to share with the school community as appropriate.

Prayers before lunch and before dismissal, individual class prayers in morning and afternoon as well as the Rosary are prayed on a regular basis. Prayers specifically during Bullying Awareness Week and Black History Month are also a part of our school day.

Individual teachers use prayer in other ways during the school day as appropriate. Students are encouraged to pray for others as various events unfold in the school, local and world community throughout the school year.
